WHAT ARE COMMONS?

The commons are, historically and primarily, products. These goods are managed not by the government and not by the market but by a third pillar, a process of commoning in the hands of the users of the good, the commoners. Common, commoners and the rules and agreements that the commoners devise for the use of the good are together a triptych that gives substance to the commoning process.

WHAT IS OUR CHALLENGE?

The project intends:

- to investigate the different approaches to commons at European level, in terms of relations between the different social actors and aimed at overcoming organizational, bureaucratic, social difficulties, etc.
- to strengthen the skills of public officials and citizens to better manage commons and build virtuous synergies together.
- to develop a training cycle among the European partners by exploiting the complementarity of their approaches and stimulate the capacity for innovation for promoting the commons.
